You will gain an understanding of the historical and social constructs of alcohol and drugs and the changes in alcohol and drug use. You will learn how to assist clients with activities of daily living and how to respond to the immediate and ongoing needs of people affected by alcohol and/or other drugs. Whether you are starting your career or looking to strengthen your capabilities, this course will equip you to make a meaningful difference in people's lives.

Entry Requirements:

- Students must be 18 years or older at the time of enrolment.
- Students must be Australian citizens, permanent residents, or have legal rights to study in Australia.
- Students should have good computer skills, internet navigation abilities for self-study research, and be efficient in interpreting and maintaining documents.
- To be well-prepared for this course, we recommend that students possess empathy to understand others' experiences, open-mindedness to appreciate diversity, the ability to apply critical thinking to analyse issues and treatments, and emotional resilience for handling sensitive topics.

Assessment Methods:

Assessment methods may include the following for each unit of competency:

- Written knowledge assessments and case studies (completed online via our Learning Management System)
- Oral questioning
- Trainer observation, practical demonstrations, role plays, or third-party verification

Students must demonstrate the ability to apply their knowledge and skills across a range of situations and varying contexts. As a result, many assessment requirements will need to be demonstrated on more than one occasion.

Please note that your trainer will randomly select knowledge questions to ask you orally. This is to verify that submitted work is genuinely your own and has not been completed with the assistance of AI tools or by another person.

What You Need To Provide:

Students should have access to a computer/tablet/laptop, speaker, microphone, camera, reliable internet and email access and Microsoft Teams installed.

Students who successfully complete this Skill Set and choose to continue their training with another provider will receive credit for 2 units towards the CHC43215 Certificate IV in Alcohol and Other Drugs qualification.
