This qualification reflects the role of individuals working in an operational role in civil construction, who undertake a prescribed range of tasks using limited practical skills and fundamental knowledge, in a defined context working under supervision. This qualification provides a solid entry point for anyone seeking to start a career in civil construction or pursue more advanced training and certifications.

COURSE INFORMATION

This traineeship-based program is structured over a period of 15 months, with training and assessment taking place for approximately half a day per month at the student's workplace. Delivery and assessment follow a one-on-one consultation approach within a student-focused delivery model, grounded in both theoretical and experiential learning. This learning occurs through the use of a simulated workplace and, where possible, real civil construction projects. The program enables students to gain experience in a range of applications, including mobile plant operation, tools and equipment handling and maintenance, dewatering, site planning, communication, safety, and risk management. As part of your course, you will gain experience in operating machinery in a real-life construction environment. This means you will be expected to train/work outdoors in various weather conditions, such as rain, heat and dust.

Packaging rules for this qualification require the completion of 16 units of which 10 are core units and 6 are elective units.

Enrolment Information:

Students are required to read the Student Handbook and agree to the Terms and Conditions prior to enrolment. All students must satisfactorily complete a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LLN) assessment at a minimum of ACSF Level 1 and participate in a course suitability discussion during the pre-enrolment process. Students may be required to complete a digital literacy assessment. Once the enrolment is reviewed, students will receive confirmation of their enrolment. You are required to apply for a personal education number known as Unique Student Identifier (USI) as part of studying a nationally recognised course. To apply for a USI number, go to www.usi.gov.au

Certification:

Upon successful completion, student will receive:

A Statement of Attainment will be issued for partial completion of the course.

Course Fees:

Course fees will depend on the chosen units of competencies. Please call or email to enquire.

Entry Requirements:

- Trainees/Students must be 18 years old or have approval from a guardian if they are under 18 years old.
- Trainees/Students must be citizen/permanent resident or Visa holder and have legal rights to work and study in Australia.
- Trainees/student on temporary resident Visas may be able to participate in traineeship providing there are meeting the specific requirements listed by Department of Home Affairs.
- Trainee/student must work in civil construction and hold CPCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry (White Card) qualification before undertaking the course.
- Trainee/student must be reasonably fit and be able to undertake manual handling tasks, work outdoors, carry items, mount and dismount earthmoving machines and use and manoeuvre hand tools, power tools and equipment. Students will be expected to work outdoors in various weather conditions, such as rain, heat and dust.

Assessment Methods:

The evidence gathering process will reflect specific requirements for units within the training package. Each student's attainment of the units of competency within this qualification is achieved by their successful completion of a range of assessment tasks activities. For each unit of Competency, these tasks may include:

- Written Knowledge Assessments and Case Studies
- Oral Questions
- Direct Observation (Practical Demonstration, Practical Role Plays, Presentation)
- Written Assessment (Projects, Individual/Group, Portfolio, Reflective Tasks).
- Third Party Assessments
- Work Samples

Students are required to demonstrate that they can apply the knowledge and skills learnt in a range of situations and in varying contexts so many of the assessment requirements of the units of competencies will need to be demonstrated on more than one occasion.

Other Information:

There are no classes scheduled during Public Holidays.

What You Need To Provide:

For practical training and assessment, students will be required to wear enclosed shoes and clothing suitable for the weather, hard hat, long sleeves, gloves, a high-visibility vest or shirt, long pants and safety boots (with safety toe cap and non-slip soles).

Further Study Options:

Students who successfully complete the course may choose to continue their studies with the RII30820 Certificate III in Civil Construction Plant Operations (available from ABV RTO 52592), or pursue specialised study, such as the RII30920 Certificate III in Civil Construction General, (available from MTACS RTO 52053).

WA Funded Student Tuition Fees:

WA funded program fees are charged per nominal hour at \$1.62 for non-concession and \$0.48 for concession with an annual fee cap for:

Youth (17-25 Years)	\$400 (fee capped - annual)
Above 25 Years	\$1,200 (fee capped - annual)
